

LENGTH SCAVENGER HUNT

YOU WILL NEED:

1. A ruler or children's measuring tape
2. Pencil
3. Length Scavenger Hunt recording sheet

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Choose the location for your scavenger hunt - your home, your garden, the local park etc.
2. Use a ruler or measuring tape to measure objects to find answers to the questions in the Length Scavenger Hunt.
3. You can measure the length, height or width of objects if you need to.
4. Write down the name of the object you have found in the box. You could also write the length of the object.
5. Do not use the same object in more than one answer box.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

1. Create your own Length Scavenger Hunt using the template provided.
2. Have your child create a Length Scavenger Hunt and have their friends or siblings complete it.
3. When your child has moved onto millimetres include measuring in millimetres in your scavenger hunt.
4. You could include specific things for your child to measure depending on the location of your scavenger hunt e.g. Measure the length of your favourite book, your bed, a park bench.

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Use a ruler or measuring tape to measure objects to help you find answers to the questions below. Do not use the same object twice.

Find an object that is 1cm in length.	Find something that is 1m in length.	Find something that is more than 1m in length.
Find something that is 10cm in length.	Find an object that is 2cm in length.	Find something that is more than 30cm but less than 60cm in length.
Find an object that is longer or taller than you are.	Find two objects that are the same length.	Find something that is less than 10cm in length.
Find something that is less than 1m in length.	Find an object that is more than 70cm but less than 1m in length.	Find something that is less than 5cm in length.
Find something that is 30cm in length.	Find something that is 5cm in length	Find three objects that are more than 20cm in length.

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Create your own questions and use a ruler or measuring tape to measure objects to help you. Do not use the same object twice.
